We shall still be holding the BBQ - weather permitting - and anybody who is not taking part in the Training and wishes to join us for BBQ only should send the enclosed form to Carol by Monday 24<sup>th</sup> March so we know how many to cater for.

This relocation means that we are not compromised for horsebox / trailer parking, so are able to accommodate more people. However, we still have to limit training places to 10, all of which have now been taken. If any club members wish to come along to practice on the cones and obstacle without tuition, take part in the afternoon fun cones and obstacle competition and/or to drive the optional way marked ride along the Lindsey Trail, we will be making a charge of  $\pounds 12.50$  (includes BBQ for 2).
